

## **MAIN IDEA**

The world needs men who know their role and bring it.

## QUESTIONS

- Opening Scripture: Psalm 139:14
  - When you hear that you are fearfully and wonderfully made, what does that mean to you?
  - What are some things that sideline men from knowing and embracing their role?
  - How does **shame**, **fear**, or **ignorance** keep you from fully stepping into your God-given role.
  - What's an area in your life where you feel uncertain or hesitant about your role? Why do you think that is?
- Reflect on Gideon's story in the Bible (Judges 6-7), where God told him to "go with the strength you have." What is the significance of God using the strength we already possess rather than asking for more?
- How has God uniquely wired you in your strengths and experiences, both good and bad? How can you use those strengths for His kingdom?
- This week, take time to reflect on how God has specifically gifted you and the unique story He has written in your life. What are the experiences or strengths that you can offer for the benefit of others and God's kingdom?

## CHALLENGE

## **ADDITIONAL ACTION ITEM**

Read **Judges 6:12-16** and reflect on how God called Gideon despite his insecurities. Consider your own insecurities and offer them to God, trusting that He can use you just as you are.
