- Why does Paul seem to focus less on cultural and political powers and more on the spiritual roots of these problems?

- 1. Which is easier, to attack people who are enemies of faith or attack your own disobedience? Why is that?
- 2. Verse 5 talks about capturing rebellious thoughts. When you think about the way you think, would you say that you have a tight leash on what you think, do you keep guard over what you think, or are you at the whim of whatever your mind comes up with?
- 3. What is the one thing you struggle with the most in your mind?
